

## **About Us**

For the Love of Dogs Academy operates from Sydney's Northern Beaches, providing disability support services through innovative animal care programs. Our participants, who must be over 18, engage in meaningful work experiences that build both practical skills and personal confidence.

In 2025, we significantly expanded our services with the launch of our Dog Programs, which generated \$64,948 in their first year of operation. These programs complement our existing People Programs and volunteer-matched initiatives.

## **Key Programs**

#### Pat & Chat Program

Social program where participants enjoy activities like movies, art workshops, and fitness groups - all surrounded by dogs in our daycare facility. Program in development as of Aug 2025.

Wag & Walk Program

A volunteer-matched program that pairs participants with local animal lovers for regular dog walks, promoting community connection and physical activity. Program in development as of Aug 2025.

#### **Animal Advocate Training**


A formal 18-month training program combining TAFE Certificate II in animal care with employment skills training.
Participants are allocated a dog within the daycare and supported to walk, bathe, medicate and do basic training while participating in structured learning.
Program in pilot phase with 2 participants enrolled and 2 more lined up if we can support them adequately.

#### **Vet Team Training**

Advanced program for Animal Advocate graduates interested in veterinary medical roles, supporting completion of Certificate IV in veterinary nursing or veterinary medicine studies. Program in development as of Aug 2025.

#### **Taster Experience Program**

Introductory program facilitated by The Vet's North to give participants initial exposure to animal care activities. Program underway with 8 participants enrolled.



#### MAJOR PARTNER IN PROGRAM DELIVERY:

**The Vet's North** provides animal ultrasound and internal medicine services in local veterinary clinics for canine and feline patients. Their generous support has been instrumental in our growth and program development.

## **Structure and Management**

For the Love of Dogs Academy is registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC). The organization operates under the governance of a committed board of directors who have provided leadership since establishment in March 2024.

## **Chairperson's Report**

"As a specialist vet, we see the 'valuable dogs'. This might mean the dogs that have had a lot of money invested in their training, or, my favourite, the dogs that have impacted peoples lives so profoundly the idea of living without them is inconceivable. Doing this for the last 15 years, I have heard so many stories of the miraculous impact dogs have had on human health. Stories of dogs who have supported their owners through chemotherapy. Stories of dogs that have refused to leave their owner's side in a life threatening mental health crisis. Stories of dogs that pulled their human out of homelessness, addiction, and the depths of loss.

Everyone deserves the chance to benefit from the companionship and uninhibited 'can't walk I'm wagging too hard' love that dogs hand out without reserve. It breaks my heart that the people that really need this can't access it. We can change this.

FY2025 has been a transformational year for For the Love of Dogs Academy. We successfully integrated Canine Kindergarten services into our operations, expanding our capacity to provide meaningful employment training while delivering essential pet care services to our community. Despite the operational challenges of this expansion, we maintained our commitment to our participants and began pilot programs that will form the foundation of our future growth.

Our focus for the coming year remains on stabilising operations, completing facility upgrades to ensure accessibility, and launching our comprehensive training programs at full capacity."

## **Our Objectives and Activities**

#### **Primary Objectives:**

**Employment Training:** Providing meaningful work experience and skills development in animal care **Community Connection**: Facilitating relationships between people with disabilities and the broader community

**Therapeutic Benefits:** Harnessing the proven benefits of human-animal interaction **Sustainable Employment:** Creating pathways to ongoing employment in the animal care sector

#### **Activities Undertaken in FY2025:**

- **Business Integration:** Successfully integrated Canine Kindergarten services (doggy daycare, grooming, training) into FLDA operations
- **Program Development:** Launched Taster Experience Program facilitated by The Vet's North, with 8 participants engaged.
- **Systems Implementation:** Established core operational systems including Dialpad (phones), ClickUp (CRM), Stripe (payments), and Xero (accounts)
- Facility Acquisition: Secured permanent facility at 2-4 Windsor Parade, North Narrabeen
- **Staffing Expansion:** Recruited Canine Programs Manager, Canine Care Team, and People Programs Manager
- Strategic Partnerships: Established training partnership with Lincoln Institute of Veterinary Business. Fit-out of the new facility is also being largely supported and funded by Cyclo Constructions, with up to 50% reductions in fit out cost due to their contributions of labour and materials
- Animal Advocate Training Pilot: Commenced pilot with 2 participants enrolling in TAFE Certificate II, and 2 more set to enrol in the next month.
- Infrastructure Investment: Invested \$19,800 in equipment to support program expansion

#### **Planned Activities for FY2026:**

- Facility Refurbishment: Complete accessibility upgrades with support from Cyclo Construction
- Program Scale-Up: Launch all four programs at full capacity once facility upgrades are complete
- **Fundraising Expansion:** Execute strategic fundraising plan to raise \$366,000 for academy development
- **Volunteer Network:** Develop strategic volunteer network for program support and facility maintenance
- **Research Initiative:** Conduct and publish research on barriers to pet ownership for people with disabilities
- Technology Upgrade: Replace aging Canine Care CRM system to safeguard service continuity





## **SECTION 3: OUR FINANCES**

## **Treasurer's Report**

It is my pleasure to present the Treasurer's Report for the financial year ended 30 June 2025 – our first full year of operation as a registered charity.

This year was a period of transformational growth, marked by the launch of our Dog Programs, the expansion of services, and significant investment in building our operational capacity.

#### 1. Overview of the Year

- · Total Income: \$176,230 (up 88% on FY2024)
- Total Expenses: \$213,796 (up 340% on FY2024)
- · Net Loss: \$(37,566) An intentional start-up investment
- · Cash on Hand: \$123,059
- Net Assets: \$7,285 The deficit reflects strategic decisions to invest early in program establishment, staffing, and infrastructure to support sustainable growth

#### 2. Income Analysis

Total income of \$176,230 came from multiple sources:

- Dog Programs: \$64,948 launched June 2025, generating this amount in their first month of operation
- Donations (VMS-related & various): \$82,513 strong community support, though funding remains variable year-to-year
- · Grant Centre for Volunteering: \$19,600 targeted funding for volunteer initiatives · People Program: \$5,381 reduced as resources shifted to establish Dog Programs
- · Sublease Income from VMS: \$3,788 creating a valuable supplementary revenue stream

#### 3. Quarterly Performance Trend

- · Aug–Oct 2024: Net loss of \$40,904 legal setup, early program development, and staffing costs
- · Nov 2024–Jan 2025: Net profit of \$20,825 boosted by major donations and grant funding
- · Feb-Apr 2025: Net loss of \$10,943 lower income period with continued program investment
- · May–Jul 2025: Net loss of \$30,561 despite \$106,892 income from Dog Programs' launch, high expenses from rent, equipment, and staffing drove the loss

#### 6. Risks & Opportunities

Risks: The organisation currently lacks secure ongoing funding sources. While donations provided \$77,382 this year, this income stream remains uncertain.

#### Current debt position:

· VMS Loan: \$140,207 (Interest-free, 3-year term - Low Risk)

· Accounts Payable: \$14,255

· ATO/Super Obligations: \$6,393

#### Opportunities:

- · Dog Programs have demonstrated strong initial uptake and income potential
- · Rental income from the VMS sublease provides reliable supplementary revenue
- · Our current cash reserves provide a short-term operational buffer








FY2025 represents a transformational year for For the Love of Dogs Academy. While we recorded a net loss of \$37,566, this reflects strategic investment in establishing our Dog Programs and building operational capacity.

The strong cash position of \$123,059 and successful program launch positions us well for future sustainability, provided we secure ongoing funding sources to support our expanded operations.

#### Immediate Priority:

Developing sustainable funding strategies to support our expanded service delivery model. On behalf of the Board, I thank our donors, volunteers, staff, and partners for their incredible commitment.
